Subject: Help needed with Mobile Clinic and Mass Vaccination

Good Afternoon,

Happy New Year and hope you are all well.

Now that we know more about the vaccines, the state allocation decision tree, distribution timeline, and the priority groups, we better understand our need of additional resources at our sites.

We are actively administering COVID-19 shots into the arms of all residents that fall into the priority group 1a (as set by CDC and IDPH). We have enlisted many volunteers to assist with the mobile clinics and mass vaccination. However, the need is great and will only increase as we move into phase 1b and 1c.

Your local health department is in need of shared resources. **That said, can your department/municipality commit to providing a staff member to assist at our daily mobile vaccine clinics (in Yorkville) that are currently happening and/or at mass vaccination clinics that are upcoming?** It is my desire to create strike teams at our mobile sites that are consistent week to week. I am in need of at least one staff member from each department/municipality for one day during the week, if possible. For example only, Yorkville Police Department is committing one staff member on Mondays and the County of Kendall is committing one staff member on Wednesdays, etc. If everyone commits one staff member, this will give us close to 10 volunteers (2 a day) to help us achieve this tremendous task we face for the next 4-6 months. The roles I am looking to fill are registration, screening, floaters, and observation/discharge.

Please let me know if you are able to assist or have any other resources that you would be willing to share.

I greatly appreciate all your support during the past 10 months and I look forward to the day in which we have achieved herd immunity and things are a little more normal.
